



Isabella County Board of Commissioners

Meetings: 4/7/2026 & 4/21/2026

- Approved placing the renewal of the Senior Millage for up to 1 mill for a term of 10 years on the August 2026 ballot. Millage accounts for about 67% of the Commission on Aging's total FY 2026 revenue.
- Approved proposals from Trane to replace five rooftop heating and cooling units and one make-up air unit at the Commission on Aging (COA) for \$229,320 and to replace the Courthouse rooftop unit for \$254,427.
- Approved a grant agreement with the Michigan Arts and Culture Council for \$3,200 to commission an outdoor mural at Coldwater Lake Family Park. An additional \$800 from the Parks budget will fulfill the required 25% grant match. The mural will be installed on the sidewall of one of the park's pavilions.
- Approved a Subaward Agreement with the Michigan Recycling Coalition (MRC) in the amount of \$7,500 for recycling education and outreach. The MRC will provide training and community outreach tools aimed at increasing material recovery and reducing contamination in the recycling stream.
- Approved an interfund loan of up to \$1 million from the General Fund to the Delinquent Tax Revolving Fund to cover a shortfall caused by rising property tax delinquencies. This interfund transfer ensures the County can meet its legal obligation to pay local taxing units on time, regardless of whether residents have paid their taxes yet.
- Approved up to six part-time Medical Examiner Investigator positions (totaling 0.3 FTE), pending a signed contract amendment from University of Michigan Health-Sparrow. These local positions are expected to improve turnaround times.
- Authorized participation in Senior Project Fresh through a Memorandum of Understanding between the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services and the COA. The COA will provide technical support to help low-income older adults enroll online, enabling them to secure coupons for fresh, locally grown fruits, vegetables, and honey.

Mt. Pleasant City Commission

Meetings: 4/13/2026 & 4/27/2026

- Approved the relocation of an access easement for Well Site #15 on Central Michigan University property, allowing for development of a new golf center to the west of Theunissen Stadium.
- Awarded the contract for the 2026 Mill Pond Park Weir Improvements & Chipp-A-Waters Park Bank Stabilization to Glasco Construction for \$249,528. The project includes repair of the Mill Pond Park Weir and Pedestrian Bridge and restoration of the riverbank at Chipp-A-Waters Park.
- Approved amendments to the Food Truck Ordinance. Mobile food units may now operate as part of the city's special events and farmers

markets if owners provide their sales tax license number to licensed event sponsors and their vehicles pass a fire department safety inspection. There is no application fee for food trucks operating solely on the applicant's property.

- Awarded the contract for the 2026 City Hall Retaining Wall & Streetscape Replacement Project to McGuirk Sand and Gravel for \$1,369,597. The project involves replacing the existing retaining walls, railings, sidewalk, streetscape, irrigation, electrical, and trees.
- Awarded the contract for the Water Resource Recovery Facility Food Waste Receiving Station and Waste Gas Burner Project to RCL Construction Co. For \$1,517,719. The project includes construction of a food waste receiving station to convert high volumes of organic waste into on-site renewable energy. The city previously secured \$800,000 for the project from the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy (\$500,00) and the Saginaw Chippewa Indian Tribe (\$300,000).

Mt. Pleasant Planning Commission

Meeting: 4/9/2026

- Recommended that the City Commission amend the Zoning Ordinance to increase the maximum permissible fence or wall height from six feet to eight feet in Industrial Districts, provided they are not located at street frontage or adjacent to civic spaces.

Mt. Pleasant Public Schools Board of Education

Meeting: 4/20/2026

- Awarded a contract for plumbing renovations at the high school to William Walter, Inc.
- Approved a two-year extension for the district's administrative contracts, extending them through June 30, 2028.

Union Township Board of Trustees

Meetings: 4/8/2026 & 4/22/2026

- Adopted a resolution to enroll a 40-acre parcel of vacant agricultural land on the north side of East Deerfield Road and east of South Whiteville Road into Michigan's Farmland and Open Space Preservation Program.
- Approved a \$63,000 contract with Wilcox Contracting for the installation of a concrete pad and sidewalk for the new Jameson Park Outdoor Fitness Court Studio, including the associated demolition and restoration of a portion of the baseball field site.
- Approved an artwork submitted by local artist Andrea Croft for the new Jameson Park Outdoor Fitness Court.
- Approved two-year renewal of the contracts with HydroCorp of Troy, Michigan for the Cross-Connection Control Program and Lead and Copper Inventory Program at a cost of \$57,169. The company conducts inspections at residential and nonresidential locations to help minimize the threat of cross-connection and backflow.
